

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At the Entrance and In the Church



Sanitize your hands before entering and leaving.



Follow the arrows and **maintain** a 2m distance from others.



Follow the usher's instructions and **occupy** assigned seating only.



Wear a mask at all times.

During Communion



Proceed to Communion Station when instructed by a sidesperson.



Observe distance as indicated.




Sanitize your hands.



Receive Holy Communion in your right hand (*instructions on reverse*).



Proceed to Lady Chapel to make your Communion (*instructions on reverse*).



Replace mask and return to your seat following arrows.

Receiving Holy Communion in Time of Pandemic

Remain 2 metres from the celebrant as he says the words of administration ('The Body of Christ etc.'). Respond 'Amen' and step forward to the first Communion Station.

Then follow the 6 basic steps:

1. With washed (i.e., sanitized) hands,
2. place your **right hand** (symbol of Christ) over your left hand
3. in the **shape of a Cross**.
4. Receive the Sacred Host in **your right hand** with desire and charity, and retire to the second Communion Station in the Lady Chapel.
5. Lifting your hands slightly, remove one side of your mask, lower your face, and consume the Host **directly in your mouth** (no grabbing necessary!).
6. Check your hand to make sure nothing of the Host is left behind, and replace your mask.

These steps are laid out by various ancient saints.

1. 'All the men who desire to communicate wash their hands, and all the woman present clean linen, when they receive Holy Communion' (*S. Caesarius of Arles*).
2. 'Place your left hand as a throne **beneath your right**, as befits one who is about to receive the King' (*S. Cyril*).
3. 'Let us draw near to it with an ardent desire, and with our hands held in **the form of the Cross** let us receive the body of the Crucified One' (*S. John of Damascus*).
4. 'Having received It **into his hand**, he asked whether they were all in charity with him, and had no complaint against him, nor any quarrel or grudge' (*Venerable Bede*).
5. 'So then, after having carefully hallowed your eyes by the touch of the holy body, partake of It' (*S. Cyril*).
6. 'Giving heed lest you lose any portion thereof; for whatever you lose, it is evidently a loss to you as it were from one of your own members' (*S. Cyril*).

BLESSING and glory and thanksgiving be unto thee Almighty

thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to

suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memorial of that his precious death, until his coming again.

Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood;

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, "TAKE, EAT; THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU: DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME."

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "DRINK YE ALL, OF THIS; FOR THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE NEW COVENANT, WHICH IS SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE REMISSION OF SINS: DO THIS, AS OFT AS YE SHALL DRINK IT, IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME."

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded;

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion;

And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and ✠ heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.

O EMMANUEL

O come, O come, and be our God-with-us
O long-sought With-ness for a world without,
O secret seed, O hidden spring of light.
Come to us Wisdom, come unspoken Name
Come Root, and Key, and King, and holy Flame,
O quickened little wick so tightly curled,
Be folded with us into time and place,
Unfold for us the mystery of grace
And make a womb of all this wounded world.
O heart of heaven beating in the earth,
O tiny hope within our hopelessness
Come to be born, to bear us to our birth,
To touch a dying world with new-made hands
And make these rags of time our swaddling bands.

BUDGET UPDATE & PLEDGE 2022

OUR ANNUAL VESTRY IN 2021 approved a budget in which we anticipated \$125,000 in congregational givings. *As of 14 December we've reached \$101,423. That means we need to raise an additional \$23,577 by the end of this month if we are to make our year-end goal.*

The good news is this:

- 1) Most parishes find themselves in this situation at year's end, so this is not a problem in which we are alone.
- 2) As of this date last year (December 14, 2020), actual parish givings were \$88,086, and our shortfall was 31,914. So we are ahead of where we were last year. *Especially given the challenges of the pandemic, this is something to celebrate.*
- 3) Finally, it is still possible to close this gap before we close the books on 2021. For six of the past seven years we have had similar shortfalls at this point in the year and each year we have come in slightly over budget by year's end.

I want to challenge each of us to two things:

- 1) If we have fallen behind in our intended givings, let's try to catch up between now and the end of December.
- 2) Let us prayerfully discern if we can make one extra offering this Christmas season to help to close this gap. The latter will almost certainly be an act of sacrifice for most of us. But let us remember that sacrifice – the Sacrifice of Calvary, represented on the Altar at each Mass – is at the heart of our religion. It is primarily through sacrifice that our lives are conformed to that of our Crucified Eucharistic Lord, whereby we come to share more and more fully in His Divine Life.

The Christmas Feast teaches us that our Salvation begins with a generous gift — the Gift of God who was willing to become Man so that we might become god. Our Lady gave over her whole life to that purpose at the Annunciation. We give of our substance to the Church so that their gifts might continue in this place for our neighbours and for ourselves.

‘And they came, every one whose heart stirred him up, and every one whom his spirit made willing, and they brought the Lord’s offering’ (BCP, p. 72, quoting Exodus 35:21).
