

Welcome to S. Bart's, Regent Park!

Today's Feast, which marks the end of the Christmas season, is a feast both of Jesus and Mary: of Jesus, because He is presented by His Mother in the Temple forty days after His birth, according to the requirements of the law; of Mary, because she submits herself to the rite of purification.

The liturgy celebrates, primarily, the entrance for the first time of the Infant Jesus into the Temple: "Behold the Lord, the Ruler, cometh into His holy Temple: rejoice and be glad, O Sion, and hasten to meet your God" (Breviary). Let us, too, go to meet Him, emulating the holy sentiments of the old Simeon who "came by the Spirit into the Temple" (Gospel: Luke 2:22-32), and filled with joy, received the Divine Child into his arms.

In order to celebrate this event more fittingly, the Church today blesses candles and gives them to us; with burning tapers, we enter the Temple in procession. The lighted candle is a symbol of the Christian life, of the faith and grace which should shine in our soul. It is also the image of Christ, the light of the world, "a light to the revelation of the Gentiles," according to Simeon's canticle. The lighted candle reminds us that we must always bear Christ in us, the source of our life, the author of faith and grace. By his grace, Jesus Himself disposes us to meet Him with livelier faith and greater love. May our meeting with him today be particularly intimate and sanctifying!

Jesus is taken to the Temple to be offered to the Father, although, being God, He was not subject to the prescriptions of the Jewish law as were the other firstborn of the Hebrews. He is the Victim who will be immolated for the salvation of the world. His presentation in the Temple is, so to speak, the offertory of His life; the sacrifice will be consummated later, on Calvary. Let us offer ourselves with Jesus.

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

Through the same Christ our Lord.

Let us pray.

LORD Jesu Christ, who art the true light that lightenest every man that cometh into the world: we beseech thee to pour out thy bless ing upon these candles, and sanc tify them with the light of thy grace; and mercifully grant, that even as they with their outward flame do scatter the darkness of night; so our hearts being inflamed with the inward brightness of thy Holy Spirit may be delivered from all blindness of iniquity: that the eyes of our souls being enlightened may discern such things as are pleasing unto thee and profitable unto us for our salvation; that finally after the darkness and dangers of this world we may attain in the end to light everlasting. Through thee, O blessed

Jesu, Redeemer of the world, who in the unity of the blessed Trinity livest and reignest God, world without end.

Let us pray.

A LMIGHTY and everlasting God, who by the mouth of Moses thy servant didst command the children of Israel to bring pure olive oil for the lamps to burn always before thy face: we beseech thee to pour the bless ing of thy grace on these candles; that like as they shed forth on us their outward beams, so of thy bounteous goodness the light of thy Holy Spirit may never fail to enlighten us inwardly in our souls. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and regineth with thee in the unity of the same Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end.

OLORD Jesu Christ, who as on this day appearing among men in the substance of our flesh wast presented by thy parents in the temple: whom Simeon in his old age, being enlightened by the light of thy Spirit, knew and blessed, taking thee in his arms: Mercifully grant; that we, being enlightened and instructed by the grace of the same Spirit, may know thee truly in our minds and love thee faithfully with all our hearts. Who livest and reignest with the Father in the unity of the same Spirit ever one God, world without end.

THE PRAYERS BEING ENDED, THE CELEBRANT SETS INCENSE IN THE THURIBLE; AND THRICE SPRINKLES THE CANDLES WITH HOLY WATER, SAYING THE ANTIPHON ASPERGES: AND THEN THRICE INCENSES THEM. THEN THE SENIOR OF THE CLERGY APPROACHES THE ALTAR, AND FROM HIM THE CELEBRANT RECEIVES A CANDLE. THEN THE CELEBRANT, STANDING IN THE MIDST OF THE ALTAR AND TURNING TO THE PEOPLE, DISTRIBUTES CANDLES FIRST TO THE SENIOR, FROM WHOM HE HIMSELF RECEIVED; THEN TO THE DEACON AND SUBDEACON, AND TO THE REST OF THE CLERGY, ONE BY ONE IN ORDER, LASTLY TO THE LAITY AT THE ALTAR RAIL: ALL KNEELING AND KISSING THE CANDLE AND THE CELEBRANT'S HAND. AND WHEN THE CELEBRANT BEGINS TO DISTRIBUTE THE CANDLES THE CHOIR SINGS AS MUCH OF THE FOLLOWING AS NECESSARY:

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Lesson for the Epistle: Malachi 3:1 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Lesson for the Epistle is written in the third chapter of Malachi, beginning at the first verse.

BEHOLD, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple; even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in; behold, he shall come, saith the Lord of hosts. But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap. And he shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the Lord an offering in righteousness. Then shall the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem be pleasant unto the Lord, as in the days of old, and as in former

years. And I will come near to you to judgement, and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against false swearers, and against those that oppress the hireling in his wages, the widow and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith the Lord of hosts.



The Holy Gospel: S. Luke 2:22

 - The Holy Gospel is written in the second chapter of the Gospel according to S. Luke, beginning at the twenty-second verse.
- Ry Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At that time: When the days of Mary's purification, according to the law of Moses, were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord; (as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) and to offer a sacrifice, according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, A pair of turtle-doves, or two young pigeons. And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ. And he came by the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said, Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, According to thy word: For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; A light to lighten the Gentiles, And the glory of thy people Israel. And Joseph and his mother marvelled at those things which were spoken of him. And Simeon blessed them, and said unto Mary his mother, Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel; and for a sign which shall be spoken against; (yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also;) that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed. And there was one Anna a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher; she was of a great age, and had lived with an

husband seven years from her virginity: and she was a widow of about fourscore and four years; which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. And she coming in that instant gave thanks likewise unto the Lord, and spake of him to all them that looked for redemption in Jerusalem. And when they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee to their own city Nazareth. And the child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of God was upon him.







Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood;

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of Me."

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded;

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion;

And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and A heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.


