Receiving Holy Communion in Time of Pandemic

Remain 2 metres from the celebrant as he says the words of administration ('The Body of Christ etc.'). Respond 'Amen' and step forward to the first Communion Station.

Then follow the 6 basic steps:

- 1. With washed (i.e., sanitized) hands,
- 2. place your right hand (symbol of Christ) over your left hand
- 3. in the **shape of a Cross**.
- 4. Receive the Sacred Host in **your right hand** with desire and charity, and retire to the second Communion Station in the Lady Chapel.
- 5. Lifting your hands slightly, remove one side of your mask, lower your face, and consume the Host **directly in your mouth** (no grabbing necessary!).
- 6. Check your hand to make sure nothing of the Host is left behind, and replace your mask.

These steps are laid out by various ancient saints.

- 1. 'All the men who desire to communicate wash their hands, and all the woman present clean linen, when they receive Holy Communion' (S. Caesarius of Arles).
- 2. 'Place your left hand as a throne **beneath your right**, as befits one who is about to receive the King' (*S. Cyril*).
- 3. 'Let us draw near to it with an ardent desire, and with our hands held in **the form of the Cross** let us receive the body of the Crucified One' (*S. John of Damascus*).
- 4. 'Having received It **into his hand**, he asked whether they were all in charity with him, and had no complaint against him, nor any quarrel or grudge (*Venerable Bede*).
- 5. 'So then, after having carefully hallowed your eyes by the touch of the holy body, partake of It' (S. Cyril).
- 6. 'Giving heed lest you lose any portion thereof; for whatever you lose, it is evidently a loss to you as it were from one of your own members' (*S. Cyril*).



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 13:1 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Epistle is written in the thirteenth chapter of the First Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, beginning at the first verse.

THOUGH I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil, rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there

be knowledge, it shall vanish away. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. For now we see in a glass darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known. And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three: but the greatest of these is charity.

Love is alone the worthy law of love:
All other laws have presupposed a taint:

Oh, teach me, Love, such knowledge as is meet

DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY: It was not until after the descent of the Holy Spirit that the Apostles fully understood the meaning of the Passion; then, instead of being scandalized, they considered it the greatest honor to follow him to preach Christ crucified.

The human eye has not sufficient light to comprehend the value of the Cross; it needs a new light, the light of the Holy Spirit. It is not by chance that in today's Gospel, immediately after the prediction of the passion, we find the healing of the blind man of Jericho. We are always somewhat blinded when faced with the mystery of suffering; when it strikes us in what we hold most near and dear,

it is easy to get lost and to grope our way like blind men through uncertainty and darkness. The Church invites us to repeat today the blind man's prayer of faith: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"

Today let us ask, not to be exempt from suffering, but to be enlightened as to its value. "Lord, that I may see!" As soon as the blind man recovered his site, immediately he followed Jesus, "glorifying God!" The supernatural light which we seek from the Lord will give us the strength to follow Him and to carry our cross as He did.
