

At the Entrance and In the Church



Sanitize your hands before entering and leaving.



Follow the arrows and maintain a 2m distance from others.

During Communion



Proceed to Communion Station when instructed by a sidesperson.



Observe distance as indicated.



Sanitize your hands.



Receive Holy Communion in your right hand (instructions on reverse).



Proceed to Lady Chapel to make your Communion (instructions on reverse).



Replace mask and return to your seat following arrows.

Receiving Holy Communion in Time of Pandemic

Remain 2 metres from the celebrant as he says the words of administration ('The Body of Christ etc.'). Respond 'Amen' and step forward to the first Communion Station.

Then follow the 6 basic steps:

- 1. With washed (i.e., sanitized) hands,
- 2. place your right hand (symbol of Christ) over your left hand
- 3. in the **shape of a Cross**.
- 4. Receive the Sacred Host in **your right hand** with desire and charity, and retire to the second Communion Station in the Lady Chapel.
- 5. Lifting your hands slightly, remove one side of your mask, lower your face, and consume the Host **directly in your mouth** (no grabbing necessary!).
- 6. Check your hand to make sure nothing of the Host is left behind, and replace your mask.

These steps are laid out by various ancient saints.

- 1. 'All the men who desire to communicate wash their hands, and all the woman present clean linen, when they receive Holy Communion' (S. Caesarius of Arles).
- 2. 'Place your left hand as a throne **beneath your right**, as befits one who is about to receive the King' (*S. Cyril*).
- 3. 'Let us draw near to it with an ardent desire, and with our hands held in **the form of the Cross** let us receive the body of the Crucified One' (*S. John of Damascus*).
- 4. 'Having received It **into his hand**, he asked whether they were all in charity with him, and had no complaint against him, nor any quarrel or grudge (*Venerable Bede*).
- 5. 'So then, after having carefully hallowed your eyes by the touch of the holy body, partake of It' (S. Cyril).
- 6. 'Giving heed lest you lose any portion thereof; for whatever you lose, it is evidently a loss to you as it were from one of your own members' (*S. Cyril*).




On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Epistle: Hebrews 9:11 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Epistle is written in the ninth chapter of the Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Hebrews, beginning at the eleventh verse.

HRIST being come an High Priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands; that is to say, not of this building; neither by the blood of goats and calves; but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us. For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling those who are unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh; how much more shall the blood of Christ, who, through the eternal Spirit, offered himself without spot to God, purify your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? And for this cause he is the Mediator of the new covenant, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first covenant, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.




THEN came to him the mother of Zebedee's children with her sons, worshipping him, and desiring a certain thing of him. And





And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion; And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and A heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.



This is my Body, which is given for you: this cup is the new testament in my Blood, saith the Lord: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.

ALL CHRISTIANS WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTISED WITH WATER IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY GHOST, AND ARE COMMUNICANT MEMBERS OF THEIR OWN CHURCHES, ARE WELCOME TO RECEIVE THE HOLY COMMUNION. THE SACRED HOST WILL BE PLACED UPON YOUR TONGUE OR IN THE PALM OF YOUR RIGHT HAND. IF YOU WISH TO RECEIVE A BLESSING, PLEASE FOLD YOUR ARMS ACROSS YOUR CHEST TO SIGNIFY THIS TO THE PRIEST. SHOULD YOU BE UNABLE TO MANAGE STEPS, HOLY COMMUNION CAN BE ADMINISTERED AT YOUR PEW. PLEASE ASK ONE OF THE SIDESMEN, WHO WILL BE HAPPY TO ASSIST YOU. THE FIRST PRAYER BOOK EXHORTATION ENCOURAGES US TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT IN FAITH AND REPENTANCE, 'DISCERNING THE LORD'S BODY.'

THE ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION IS NOW READ FOR THE BENEFIT OF THOSE WHO ARE WATCHING MASS ONLINE AND UNABLE TO RECEIVE CHRIST SACRAMENTALLY DURING THIS MASS.



POETRY CORNER

THE PASSION

by George Herbert (1593-1633)

Since blood is fittest, Lord, to write Thy sorrows in, and bloody fight; My heart hath store; write there, where in One box doth lie both ink and sin:

That when sin spies so many foes, Thy whips, thy nails, thy wounds, thy woes, All come to lodge there, sin may say, No room for me, and fly away.

Sin being gone, oh fill the place, And keep possession with thy grace; Lest sin take courage and return, And all the writings blot or burn.

DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE

TODAY PASSIONTIDE BEGINS, a time especially consecrated to the remembrance and loving contemplation of the sorrows of Jesus. The veiled crucifix and statues, the absence of the Gloria in the Mass and the Gloria Patri in the responsories of the Divine Office—are all signs of mourning by which the church commemorates Our Lord's Passion. Pope S. Leo exhorts us to participate "in the Cross of Christ, in order that we also may do something which will unite us to what He has done for us, for as the Apostle says, 'if we suffer with Him, we shall be glorified with Him." Therefore, we must not only meditate on Jesus' sufferings, but also take part in them; only by bearing His passion in our heart and in our body (cf. 2 Corinthians 4:10) shall we be able to share in its fruits. So it is in the liturgy of this season the Church

repeats more insistently than ever: "If you hear the voice of the Lord, harden not your hearts." The voice of the Lord makes itself heard in these days, not by words, but by the eloquent testimony of deeds, by the great events of the Passion—a mystery which gives us the most convincing proof of his infinite love for us. Let us, therefore, open our hearts to the sublime lessons of the Passion: let us see how much Jesus has loved us and how much we ought to love Him in return; let us learn that, if we wish to follow Him, we, too, must suffer and bear the Cross with Him and after Him. At the same time, let us open our hearts to a lively hope; for our salvation is in the Passion of Jesus. In today's Epistle (Hebrews 9:11-15) S. Paul presents to us the majestic figure of Christ, the Eternal High Priest, who "by His Blood, entered once into the holies, [that is heaven] having obtained eternal redemption." The Passion of Jesus has redeemed us; it has opened once again the Father's house to us; it is then the motive for our hope.
