
The Holy Gospel is written in the first chapter of the Gospel according to S. John, beginning at the nineteenth verse.


Ry Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Today's poem is the last of seven Advent Sonnets by the English priest-poet, Malcolm Guite. The sonnets are based on the Great 'O' Antiphons that are sung before and after the Magnificat from 16 to 23 December, and which inspired the well-known Advent hymn, 'O come, O come, Emmanuel.'

#### **O EMMANUEL**

by Malcolm Guite (1957-)

O come, O come, and be our God-with-us
O long-sought With-ness for a world without,
O secret seed, O hidden spring of light.
Come to us Wisdom, come unspoken Name
Come Root, and Key, and King, and holy Flame,
O quickened little wick so tightly curled,
Be folded with us into time and place,
Unfold for us the mystery of grace
And make a womb of all this wounded world.
O heart of heaven beating in the earth,
O tiny hope within our hopelessness
Come to be born, to bear us to our birth,
To touch a dying world with new-made hands
And make these rags of time our swaddling bands.

# **BUDGET UPDATE & COVENANT 2023**

OUR ANNUAL VESTRY IN 2022 approved a budget in which we anticipated \$135,000 in congregational givings. As of 15 December we've reached \$121,989. That means we need to raise an additional \$13,011 by the end of this month if we are to make our year-end goal.

# The good news is this:

- 1) Most parishes find themselves in this situation at year's end, so this is not a problem in which we are alone.
- 2) As of this date last year (December 15, 2021), actual parish givings were \$102,577 and our shortfall was \$22,423. Given that our budget last year was lower (\$125,000), the fact that we are so far ahead this year really is something to celebrate.
- 3) Finally, it is still possible to close this gap before we close the books on 2022. For seven of the past eight years we have had similar shortfalls at this point in the year and each year we have come in slightly over budget by year's end.

## Please consider the following in the coming weeks:

- 1) If you have fallen behind in your intended givings, please try to catch up between now and the end of December.
- 2) Please prayerfully discern if you can make one extra offering this Christmas season to help to close this gap. The latter will almost certainly be an act of sacrifice for most of us. But please remember that sacrifice the Sacrifice of Calvary, represented on the Altar at each Mass is at the heart of our religion. It is primarily through sacrifice that our lives are conformed to

that of our Crucified Eucharistic Lord, whereby we come to share more and more fully in His Divine Life.

The Christmas Feast teaches us that our Salvation begins with a generous gift — the Gift of God who was willing to become Man so that we might become god. Our Lady gave over her whole life to that purpose at the Annunciation. We give of our substance to the Church so that their gifts might continue in this place for our neighbours and for ourselves.

'And they came, every one whose heart stirred him up, and every one whom his spirit made willing, and they brought the Lord's offering' (BCP, p. 72, quoting Exodus 35:21).

A BIG THANK-YOU to all who have submitted covenant forms as part of our Joyful Giving Programme! We have received very generous pledges from 12 parishioners; 10 other Pre-Authorised Debits remain unchanged from last year. Thank you to all our givers for your continued generosity to our parish.
