The Liturgy of the Word

The Epistle: Galatians 6:11 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Epistle is written in the sixth chapter of the Epistle of Paul to the Galatians beginning at the eleventh verse.

Y E see with what large letters I write unto you with my own hand. As many as desire to make a fair show in the flesh, they constrain you to be circumcised; only lest they should suffer persecution for the cross of Christ. For neither they themselves who are circumcised keep the law; but desire to have you circumcised, that they may glory in your flesh. But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. And as many as walk according to this rule, peace be on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God. From henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus. Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.


The Holy Gospel: S. Matthew 6:24 (PLEASE REMAIN STANDING)

 The Holy Gospel is written in the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to S. Matthew, beginning at the twenty-fourth verse.

TO man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and Mammon. Therefore I say unto you, Be not anxious about your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? Behold the fowls of the air; for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they? Which of you by being anxious can add one cubit unto his stature? And why be ye anxious concerning raiment? Consider the lilies of the field how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin: and yet I say unto you, that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to-day is, and to-morrow is cast into the oven; shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith? Therefore be not anxious, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Be ye not therefore anxious about the morrow; for the morrow shall take care for itself: sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

MUSIC NOTE

This Sunday marks the return of the choir after a two-month summer hiatus. The choir works diligently throughout the year, rehearsing on Thursdays, and singing on Sundays and other Red Letter Days. Our task and our purpose is to sing the best music possible, in service of the liturgy, making the texts used in worship more powerful, more beautiful and more memorable.

At the heart of our choral programme is Gregorian chant, the most ancient music of the Western tradition, enriched by the polyphony of the Middle Ages and Renaissance, and branching into the expansive styles of the 17th and 18th centuries, French Romanticism and the treasures of the English Cathedral tradition.

Today, the choir is singing a choral setting of the *Asperges me* by celebrated composer T.L. Victoria (1548-1611), based on the original chant melody that is well known to us all. Cantors from the choir will lead the singing of the Minor Proper (the Introit, Gradual, Alleluia, Offertory and Communion antiphons), and the chant *Ave verum corpus*, accompanied by organ, at Communion. Our Offertory motet is a setting of Psalm 81 by English composer Adrian Batten (1591-1637), which paints the text colourfully and imaginatively. Finally, we will sing the *Angelus* at the end of mass, in Anglican chant style, with a harmonization from S. Mary's, Bourne St in London, by Shane Fletcher (1982).
