

SOLEMN MASS FOR THE FEAST DAY OF S. KATERI TEKAKWITHA: Join S. Bart's in celebrating the feast day of Canada's first Indigenous saint this coming Wednesday, 17 April at 6:15 p.m. Our preacher will be Archbishop Chris Harper, and the choir for the service will be directed by Robert Busiakiewicz. The service will be offered inperson as well as live-streamed. Canonized in 2012, Kateri is a Catholic saint and virgin who was an Algonquin–Mohawk.

**NEW RELIQUARIES!** This morning Father Hannam will bless two new reliquaries for use on our altars. The reliquaries belong to the Parish, but one contains a relic of S. ### CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER GROUP

#### SATURDAYS IN EASTERTIDE 10 AM - 11 AM

The foundation of the spiritual life is prayer; the way that leads to progressive co-operation and union with God is mental prayer, passing into contemplative prayer. The Saturday morning prayer hour is both a practical introduction to passing from vocal prayer, through lectio divina, to prayer of stillness, and also the perfect preparation for hearing the Saturday Mass and making a recollected communion. We begin at 10 o'clock with Terce (The third hour of the traditional Daily Office — 10-12 minutes), followed by a guided lectio divina of a short patristic writing on prayer (10 minutes). The hour concludes with half an hour of silent, monologic prayer, or prayer of the heart. Those who wish to stay for the Saturday Mass are encouraged to do so.

'They took my love away, my day is night'
And then she hears her name, she hears Love say
The Word that turns her night, and ours, to Day.

### **™ DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE №**

WHEN EARLY CHRISTIAN ARTISTS adorned the catacombs with pictures, one of their themes was Jesus the Good Shepherd. What they had first in mind, no doubt, was Jesus as shepherd of the dead. But, remarkably, they represented the Good Shepherd as shepherd of the stars. He is the cosmic shepherd, the universal shepherd, whose watchful care infuses and governs the whole order of creation, and brings it to its final redemption in himself: "there shall be one flock and one shepherd".

When we celebrate Jesus as the Good Shepherd, as we do today, what we celebrate is the universal providence of God, made manifest to us in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ; and that is, of course, why this Gospel lesson belongs to Eastertide. We celebrate the universal providence of God, that watchful care, that unwearied love which governs all creation, from the highest angel to the least atom. "Not a sparrow falleth without your heavenly father." By ways mysterious, past our finding out, the world is shepherded. Even from our evils, he makes good to come; even from our dying, he makes resurrection. "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for thou art with me; thy rod and staff comfort me".

We celebrate the providence of God, and it is profoundly important that we do so, because that is the basic principle upon which our moral and spiritual life as Christians must be founded. The ultimate truth of things is not evil, but good; the power which truly governs at this and every moment is the love of God. "O God, thou hast searched me out and known me; thou knowest my down-sitting and up-rising: thou understandest my thoughts long before". That all-embracing providence is sure and steadfast, and surely manifest in Jesus Christ. He is the Good Shepherd who gives his life for the sheep.
