OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM: There is renewed interest in re-founding the parish cell of Our Lady of Walsingham, which went into abeyance after the death of Father Pashler. Like the parish ward of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament, which we are in the process of re-founding (we have now had several successful meetings, and now have six members!), this organisation was once an important stimulus to devotion and sound doctrine in our parish. A cell of Our Lady of Walsingham would mean a formal tie with the Holy House and Shrine at Walsingham, Norfolk, the foremost Marian shrine in the Anglican World, and our Shrine would be listed as amongst affiliated shrines. *A first meeting will be held this coming <u>Friday, 26 April, at 7 p.m.</u> We will say the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary together and then discuss next steps.*

CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER GROUP Saturdays in Eastertide 10 a.m. - 11 a.m.

The foundation of the spiritual life is prayer; the way that leads to progressive co-operation and union with God is mental prayer, passing into contemplative prayer. The Saturday morning prayer hour is both a practical introduction to passing from vocal prayer, through *lectio divina*, to prayer of stillness, and also the perfect preparation for hearing the Saturday Mass and making a recollected communion. We begin at 10 o'clock with *Terce* (The third hour of the traditional Daily Office — 10-12 minutes), followed by a guided *lectio divina* of a short patristic writing on prayer (10 minutes). The hour concludes with half an hour of silent, monologic prayer, or prayer of the heart. Those who wish to stay for the Saturday Mass are encouraged to do so.

THE BREAKFAST PROGRAMME is open each Thursday. Doors open at 5:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m., and hot food is served beginning at 6:00 a.m.

I hope indeed; but hope itself is fear Viewed on the sunny side; I hope, and disregard the world that's here, The prizes drawn, the sweet things that betide; I hope, and I abide.

2024 Actual to 31 March: \$39,837 2024 Budget to 31 March: \$41,250 (2023 Actual to 31 March: \$31,157)

To date for 2024, we have a shortfall of \$1,413 according to the budget that was approved at Vestry on March 3rd. With that said, 2024 is off to a good start, well ahead of 2023! Warm thanks to all those who so generously support our parish!

CAN YOU IMAGINE the sheer bewilderment and consternation of Easter Day, and those appearances of the risen Christ? No wonder Thomas doubted! Can you imagine the state of mind of the disciples during those fifty days from Easter to Pentecost? Charles Williams, the great British novelist and poet, wrote a play about this called "Terror of Light." In it Peter says, "I do not see his meaning in all this waiting and watching," and Thomas replies: "I do not see his meaning in anything at all, and the longer we wait the less I see his meaning. I am quite sure that our Lord was incredibly important, and I haven't the least idea what we ought to do about it..." "Behold, the former things have passed away."

Peter and Thomas express bewilderment and dismay, but the meaning was there in the words of Jesus: "A woman, when she is in travail, hath sorrow, because her hour is come: but as soon as she is delivered, she remembereth no more the anguish, for joy that a child is born into the world." All this bewilderment, all this perplexity, all this anguish, he tells us, is nothing but the birth-pangs of new life. It is not the dumb pain of mourning. It is the pain of struggle and transformation, the breaking of the preparatory state of our old nature, which involves our old attitudes and expectations. It is the birth-pangs of new life in the spirit, the new life of faith, which dares to believe what it has not yet seen. "Behold, I make all things new." (Revelation 21.5)

The joy of Easter is the joy of faith, which sees beyond circumstances, beyond the natural and inevitable. This joy sees beyond the grave, and rejoices in hope and love and makes all things new. And that joy, "no man taketh from you."
