#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 12:1 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Epistle is written in the twelfth chapter of the First Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians beginning at the first verse.

CONCERNING spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. You know that when you were Gentiles, you

were carried away unto these dumb idols, even as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed; and that no man can say JESUS IS LORD, but by the Holy Spirit. Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are diversities of ministrations, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God, who worketh all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man for the common good. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues. But all these worketh that one and the self-same Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.
