





THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Epistle: Hebrews 13:7 (PLEASE BE SEATED)

The Epistle is written in the thirteenth chapter of the Epistle to the Hebrews, beginning at the seventh verse.

BRETHREN: Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the word of God: whose faith follow, considering the end of their conversation. Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, and to-day, and for ever. Be not carried about with divers and strange doctrines. For it is a good thing that the heart be established with grace; not with meats, which have not profited them that have been occupied therein. We have an altar, whereof they have no right to eat which serve the tabernacle. For the bodies

of those beasts, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are burned without the camp. Wherefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate. Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach. For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come. By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his Name. But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased. Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves. For they watch for your souls, as they that must give account.

Music Note

This evening's music features English composer Martin Shaw's (1895-1958) Anglican Folk Mass, written soon after the end of the First World War. Shaw remained deeply committed through his career to promoting choral music in schools, churches and wider society, and tonight's mass shows his intention to write music of good quality that could be sung in both large and small parishes, as well as the influence of Gregorian chant.

Tonight's motets come from early-to-mid 13th-century Paris, where clerics were writing simple devotional poems, in Latin, set to appealing tunes, telling of the admirable attributes of various saints. Tonight's saint would have been held in high honour in these circles, as he is the patron saint of clerics! Accompanied by medieval harp and fiddle, these songs give us a small glimpse of the freshness and beauty of popular piety eight centuries ago.
