STATIONS OF THE CROSS & MYSTAGOGY: Fridays in Lent at 7:00 p.m. We will read together E.R. Mascall's *Christ, the Christian, and the Church*. Fr Eric Lionel Mascall, O.G.S. (1905-1993) was a priest of the Church of England and, along with his friends Austin Farrer and Michael Ramsay, was one of the great Anglican theologians of the 20th century. He was one of the foremost interpreters of the thought of St Thomas Aquinas and his theology was a Thomist synthesis informed by his study of the Church Father's and the early Church's dogmatic pronouncements, and guided by the English Thomist Richard Hooker. *Christ, the Christian, and the Church* sets out in a robust yet accessible way the classical Doctrine of the Incarnation, then points out the limitations of some modern attempts to 'update' it, and then situates other aspects of the Catholic Faith — e.g., the Church, the Sacraments — within the wider context of the Incarnation of the Word.

▼ DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE

TODAY'S GOSPEL brings out the close connection between the Transfiguration and the Passion of Jesus. Moses and Elias appeared on Tabor on either side of the Saviour. They conversed with Him, and as S. Luke explains, talked specifically about his coming Passion: "They spoke of his decease, that he should accomplish in Jerusalem" (S. Luke 9:31).

The divine Master wished to teach His disciples in this way that it was impossible – for Him as well as for them – to reach the glory of the Transfiguration without



passing through suffering. It was the same lesson that he would give later to the two disciples at Emmaus: "Ought not Christ to have suffered these things and so to enter into His glory?" (*Luke 24:26*). What has been disfigured by sin cannot regain its original supernatural beauty except by way of purifying suffering.
