SUNDAY SERVICES IN SUMMER



Please note that from Sunday, 6 July through until Sunday, 31 August (inclusive), S. Bart's will move to one weekly service — on Sundays. This will be a Sung Mass, and it will begin at 10:30 a.m. *Beginning this week (29 June), and continuing through the summer, the weekday Masses and Morning Prayer will be on hiatus.*

THE BREAKFAST PROGRAMME continues to be open each Thursday with the doors opening at 5:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m., and hot food being served beginning at 6:00 a.m. *There will be no change to Breakfast Programme hours this summer. However, we will be closed on Thursday, 7 August.*

THE FOOD BANK: Our doors are open Mondays and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. *The last day for the Food Bank before summer closure will be Thursday, 3 July.*

THE REV'D CANON HAROLD NAHABEDIAN, a good friend of S. Bart's, died on Wednesday, 18 June. His funeral mass will be celebrated at the Church of S. Mary Magdalene on Saturday, 5 July at 11 a.m.

THE GENERAL SYNOD OF THE CANADIAN CHURCH met this past week in London, Ontario, and has elected the Bishop of Ottawa, Shane Parker, to be Primate of Canada. He is being installed at S. Paul's Cathedral today (the Feast of SS. Peter & Paul).
