SPIRITUAL DIRECTION IN SEPTUAGESIMA-TIDE: The Father Vicar will be available during the 'gesimas' for spiritual direction in advance of Lent. Please consider taking the time to discuss your Lenten discipline in advance of the Great Forty Days.

OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM: *There is renewed interest in re-founding the parish cell of Our Lady of Walsingham, which went into abeyance after the death of Father Pashler. Like the parish ward of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament, we are in the process of re-founding this organisation, which was once an important stimulus to devotion and sound doctrine in our parish. A cell of Our Lady of Walsingham would mean a formal tie with the Holy House and Shrine at Walsingham, Norfolk, the foremost Marian shrine in the Anglican World, and our Shrine would be listed as amongst affiliated shrines.* **This Wednesday, February 4 at 7 p.m.: Rosary & Mass of Our Lady of Walsingham.**

2025 PALMS AND PALM CROSSES will be collected between now and Quinquagesima (Sunday, 15 February) to be burned to make Ash Wednesday ashes. Please leave them in the basket provided at the back of the church.




THE FOOD BANK: The Food Bank is open every Monday and Thursday from 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.
