'HEART SPEAKETH TO HEART'

CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER GROUP

FRIDAYS AT 5:30 PM

Beginning this week, a weekly Friday evening gathering devoted to the Prayer of the Heart, spiritual discussion, and Eucharistic Adoration will meet following evening prayer. These sessions are meant to help us learn, little by little, how to lift up the heart to Christ and offer ourselves to Him in simplicity and prayer. Drawing from the Christian tradition of interior prayer, we will reflect on how the Prayer of the Heart brings us into deeper contact with God in the depths of the soul, and how this inward turning toward Him continues and deepens our worship before the Blessed Sacrament. The evening will follow this rhythm: 5:30 p.m. Evening Prayer; 6:00 p.m. Reading and discussion; 7:00 p.m. Eucharistic Adoration. The group will be practical as well as reflective: not only reading about prayer, but learning how to remain before God with simplicity, faith, and perseverance. Readings and source packets will be shared throughout the series. *No previous experience is required. All are welcome!*

CONFRATERNITY OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT will meet on Wednesday, 3 June at 7 p.m. for Vespers of the Blessed Sacrament & Benediction.

The Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament promotes careful attention to Preparation before and Thanksgiving after, every Communion. Its members are encouraged to make one or more of the following at every Eucharistic celebration they are part of: Acts of Faith, of Adoration, of Spiritual Communion, of Thanksgiving, of Reparation, of Intercession, of Prayer for the Visible Unity of the Church. TRINITY SUNDAY

by Malcolm Guite (1957-)

In the Beginning, not in time or space,
 But in the quick before both space and time,
 In Life, in Love, in co-inherent Grace,
 In three in one and one in three, in rhyme,

In music, in the whole creation story,
In His own image, His imagination,
The Triune Poet makes us for His glory,
And makes us each the other's inspiration.
He calls us out of darkness, chaos, chance,
To improvise a music of our own,
To sing the chord that calls us to the dance,
Three notes resounding from a single tone,
To sing the End in whom we all begin;
Our God beyond, beside us and within.

✠ DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE ✠

WHEN we try to pray, what happens? Initially, we experience emptiness, obscurity, distraction. Then perhaps we have a dim awareness that the activity of prayer, which at first we take to be of our making, is actually the activity of Another. We have the sense of being “prayed in”; we realize that on the deepest level it is not we who pray, but God who is praying in us. And God who so prays within us is specifically God the Trinity. We find ourselves caught up into a conversation that is already in progress—a divine conversation, the eternal dialogue of the Trinity. We each hear God the Father saying to us personally, “You are my beloved



Son”; we become children in the Son, and through the Spirit we make our own filial response, “Abba, Father.” Such is the significance of the doctrine of the Trinity. God is love—not self-love but mutual, shared love. God is exchange, self-giving, solidarity. If that is indeed what the doctrine of the Trinity is saying, then manifestly it is no mere piece of abstract speculation, devoid of practical content, but something that has startling, revolutionary consequences for our own personhood. It is concerned with matters of life and death—of eternal life and eternal death.
