'HEART SPEAKETH TO HEART'

CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER GROUP

FRIDAYS AT 5:30 PM

Continuing this week, a weekly Friday evening gathering devoted to the Prayer of the Heart, spiritual discussion, and Eucharistic Adoration will meet following Evening Prayer. These sessions are meant to help us learn, little by little, how to lift up the heart to Christ and offer ourselves to Him in simplicity and prayer. Drawing from the Christian tradition of interior prayer, we will reflect on how the Prayer of the Heart brings us into deeper contact with God in the depths of the soul, and how this inward turning toward Him continues and deepens our worship before the Blessed Sacrament. The evening will follow this rhythm: 5:30 p.m. Evening Prayer; 6:00 p.m. Reading and discussion; 7:00 p.m. Eucharistic Adoration. The group will be practical as well as reflective: not only reading about prayer, but learning how to remain before God with simplicity, faith, and perseverance. Readings and source packets will be shared throughout the series. *No previous experience is required. All are welcome!*

✠ DEVOTIONAL VIGNETTE ✠

FOR SACRED HEART

AFTER WE HAVE CONTEMPLATED THE EUCHARIST, a gift crowning all the gifts of the love of Jesus for men, the Church invites us to give direct consideration to the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the source and cause of all His gifts. We may call the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus the feast of His love for us. “Behold this Heart which has so loved men,” the Church says to us on this day, showing us that it is truly “in the Heart of Christ, wounded by our sins, that God has deigned to give us the infinite treasures of His love” (cf. Collect). Today’s liturgy inspired with this thought, reviews the immense benefits we owe to the love of Christ and sings a hymn in praise of His love. “*Cogitationes cordis ejus*,” chants the Introit of the Mass: “The thoughts of His Heart” – the Heart of Jesus – “are to all generations: to deliver them from death, to feed them in time of famine.” The Heart of Jesus is always in search of souls to save, to free from the snares of sin, to wash in His Blood, to feed with His Body. The Heart of Jesus is always living in the Eucharist to satisfy the hunger of all who long for Him, to welcome and console all those who, disillusioned by the vicissitudes of life, take refuge in Him, seeking peace and refreshment. Jesus Himself is our support on the hard road of life. “Take up My yoke upon you and learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of heart, and you shall find rest for your souls, Alleluia.” It is impossible to eliminate sorrow from our life; yet if we live for Jesus we can suffer in peace and find in the Heart of Jesus repose for our weary soul.

For more than 40 years, **St. Bartholomew's Children's Centre** has been blessed to receive student employment grants from the Human Resources Development Canada Summer Jobs Program, which have enabled us to hire two students each summer to assist our staff in caring for children ages 6 to 12. These grants have provided valuable employment opportunities for young people while helping us maintain a safe, engaging, and high-quality summer program for the children and families we serve.

This year, for the first time, funding was not approved for two deserving students, leaving them at risk of losing the opportunity to work with us this summer.

The students we hire play a vital role in supporting our staff and enriching the experience of the children in our program. Many of these young people were once participants in our centre, later returned as volunteers, and eventually sought summer employment through the HRDC Canada Summer Jobs Program. Through this journey, they develop leadership skills, gain valuable work experience, and become positive role models for the next generation of children attending our program.

We are seeking to raise \$9,500 to fund these two student positions and ensure they can fully participate in our summer program. These young people have demonstrated commitment, enthusiasm, responsibility, and a desire to grow through service. We do not want a lack of funding to prevent them from receiving the mentorship, experience, and personal development this opportunity provides.

We invite members of our church family and community to prayerfully consider supporting this important need. Every gift, regardless of size, brings us closer to our goal. Together, we can provide meaningful employment opportunities for these students while continuing to offer our children a nurturing, enriching, and well-supported summer experience.
